

PERFORMANCE OF TCO FOR THE PERIOD **JANUARY 2019 TO JUNE 2021**

1. Collected the CESS of RS. 14.196 Million against the Target of RS. 13.00 Million for the period of Jan-Dec, 2019 including arrears, penalties etc.
2. Collected the CESS of RS. 10.40 Million against the Target of RS. 11.25 Million for the period of Jan-Dec, 2020 i.e. collection percentage of 92.5% despite of the fact that the pandemic COVID-19 not only adversely impacted the Textile Industry but also there was lockdown of the Textile Mills to prevent spread of the COVID-19 viruses.
3. Collection of Textile Statistics monthly & dissemination of data to various Government departments on a monthly, quarterly and annual basis.
4. Published Annual Statistics Report on “Performance of Textile Industry 2018-19” & draft report on “Performance of Textile Industry 2019-2020” is prepared and will be published shortly
5. Development & improvement in online TCO-1 Proforma for expeditious collection of textile statistics from the Textile Industry of Pakistan.
6. Provide Material for Economic Survey of Textile Industry till the Fiscal Year 2020-21 (Jul-Mar) to Economic Affairs Division.
7. Stitching Machine operators’ Training Program (SMOT) Phase-III was launched w.e.f **20-03-2019**.
8. **2520** Trainees were enrolled out of which **185** were dropped out & **2335** Trainees have been passed out against the target of 1800.
9. The target was achieved well before time on **16-02-2020**.
10. 57% of the Total Trainees are women.
11. Over all about 11000 Trainees have been Trained under the different phases of SMOT Program since 2016 till date.
12. Most of the Trainees are employed in the Textile Industry.
13. The 8th meeting of Defunct Textile Training Institute Management Board (TTIMB) Was convened; in effect, a stock-taking survey for strengthening of EDF Funded Textile Institutes was conducted.
14. Financial Need Analysis of 7-EDF Funded Textile Institute completed after visit & meeting with each institute.

15. TCO in compliance with the Textile Policy Implementation to accomplish Inspection of machinery under TUF Scheme. 117 Textile Units have been inspected by the officer of TCO and after verification, 158 Inspection Reports have been forwarded to Textile Division.
16. TCO organized several meetings regarding “Shortage of Supply of Hydrogen Peroxide to Textile Processing Industry” with all stakeholders to resolve the shortage of Hydrogen Peroxide to Textile Industry, which was hampering US\$ 4 billion export-oriented Textile Industry & ensures regular supply to Textile Industry by producers.
17. The Regional Office of TCO was established in Faisalabad in 2018.
18. Attended National Textile University`s Board of Governors & Selection Board meetings.
19. Looked after the issues of Pakistan Cotton Standard Institute (PCSI)
20. TCO facilitated Pakistan Textile City including the provision of office space, transfer of records & also facilitated the Federal Commercial Audit of the above Textile City.
21. Textile Commissioner, being a member of the Technical Committee for Textile Division, facilitated to hire Nespak after completing all codal formalities of PPRA Rules.
22. On the direction of the Federal Secretary, Textile Division TCO successfully acquired the status of NPO from FBR for the Karachi Garments City Company (KGCC) and saved RS.680 Million of the National Exchequer.
23. On the advice of Federal Secretary, Textile Division, TCO retrieved the 0.75 acres plot from local influentials to establish Textile Training Research Center at Super Highway Karachi.
24. On the direction of MOC as per request of the POF Institute of Technology, TCO prepared & submitted a technical comprehensive proposal for the establishment of a Multi-skilled Textile Training Centre at POF Wah Cantt.
25. TCO being the collaborating partner with NED University of Engineering & Technology (NEDUET) & DICE (Distinguish Innovation Collaboration Entrepreneurship) foundation USA, arranged 5th DICE & 4th NEDITC 2020.
